Secretary's message



Tournament Bookkeeper's Message



The tournament fund is in good financial shape and I appreciate your timely entries into the RGC tournaments. And most of you (but not all) have attached entry slips along with your payments which is extremely important especially when making cash payments. Entry slips are available in the pro shop or in the Men's Restroom.

It is important that you sign up for each tournament as soon as possible because we have a limited number of tee times available for each tournament. If we know early enough that the number of golfers entering the tournament exceeds our estimate, we **MAY** be able to obtain additional tee times from the pro shop. But if you wait until the due date (normally ten days before each tournament play date) you risk not being able to play in that tournament. **Please be aware that entries received AFTER the published due date will not be accepted.**

While we have not had to turn anyone away (the pro shop has been very accommodating) our tournaments have generated a lot of interest and the possibility exists that the number of golfers will exceed our tee time availability and some golfers will be unable to play. Who doesn't play is based on when I receive your entry. The later your entry is received increases the possibility that you may not be able to play. **So my best advice to you is sign up early!**

We make every attempt to post the tournament results as soon after the tournament concludes as we can. Once the results are posted on the website I allow 3 to 5 days before I pay the golf course and the amounts are posted to your individual accounts. This is done to allow golfers who played in the tournament to appeal the results. Sometimes, errors are made and we want the results to be accurate before we pay the golf course because after we pay the prize fund it's extremely difficult to make corrections. **So it's extremely important that once the results are posted on the website that you bring any errors to the attention of the Tournament Director immediately.**

A number of golfers still have unredeemed prizes/refunds coming to them. While I try to catch you on tournament days some of you have not played in many tournaments or haven't checked with me at the conclusion of your round to claim your prize/refund.

Please be aware that at every home tournament a list is posted next to the scoring sheets listing all golfers who are due a prize or a refund who are playing in that particular days tournament. So please check the Bulletin Board before your round and if your name is listed, see me at the conclusion of your round to receive your prize/refund.

The following golfers have prizes coming to them which are over 6 months old. Please e-mail me at (Corney1@Starstream.net) and let me know how I can get your prizes to you. **If I don't receive instructions from you by May 31, 2009, the funds will be deposited in the Tournament Fund to be used in future tournaments.**

I just want to remind everybody that the Handicap Committee posts scores for all tournaments (home and away) with the exception of the Diamond Tournaments. For the Diamond Tournaments, you are required to post your own score as a "Tournament" (not "Home"). Do not forget to adjust your score based on Equitable Stroke Control. If you are unsure how to adjust, see the following link:

Rules Chairperson's Message



The 2009 Golf season is well underway and with it has come a more noticeable presence for your Rules Committee. Serving you this year on the committee will be Charlie Aichele, Al Coney, Sr., Mary Daby, Dick Hunt, Ken Lyon, Boyd Robertson, Jesse Sierra, and Bob Pando, as well as myself. You may have seen some of these people at recent events ready to accept your scorecards when you finish your round.

The committee has accepted from your Board some new responsibilities that will continue to keep our pace of play at the forefront. They will be there to monitor times and make decisions on rules situations that may come up at tournaments. Getting a ruling while those involved are still present and able to be advised of penalties before leaving the course is the best way to handle issues before they

become big problems. In addition, having rules answers readily available will help to assure that the integrity of the tournament and the protection of the field are upheld.

More specifically we will:

1. Check for starting and finishing times recorded on the individual cards and post them for the record. Any penalties incurred will be assessed at that time.
2. Make sure the cards are signed and attested.
3. Address any rules violations or situations that may have occurred during the round. Any penalties incurred will be assessed and explained at that time.

Your Board of Directors and we hope that this small change will give you further confidence that RGC is committed to the good of the game and your enjoyment on the course.

Recently I was asked for an easy way to remember which rules violations incurred a 1-stroke penalty and which incurred a 2-stroke penalty. After giving this much thought, I was at a loss to come up with a definitive answer. So, I will give you my best-educated response.

The general penalty for violating rules in stroke play, is 2-strokes or disqualification.

For example: Rule 13 states that you must play the ball as it lies doing nothing to improve the lie of your ball, the area of your intended swing, or the line of your play. If you do so by replacing a detached divot or tamping down spike marks you incur a 2-stroke penalty.

A 1-stroke penalty is normally assessed when a procedure is violated or when no free relief is available for the lie of your ball.

For example: If you lift your ball without marking it first or when you take relief from a water hazard, you incur a 1-stroke penalty.

With regard to 1-stroke penalties, you have to ask what happened next to determine if there would be an additional penalty for breach of the general rule.

It can sometimes get confusing.

Consequently, RGC has wisely chosen to provide you with the resource to get it right the first time.

Your Rules Committee members will be noticeably present at all tournaments to explain the application of any penalties that may be assessed and to avoid the assessment of penalties that are not incurred. As a committee, we are there to help you. Don't hesitate to make us useful.


