It is also that time of year when players should begin looking to see if they will have enough tournaments behind them in order to qualify for the NCGA events that will be played early next year. Of course I am speaking of the Zone Qualifier, and the 4-Ball Net Qualifier that are usually played in the Wintery months of January and February. If you plan on participating in these events in 2011, now is the time to get in the required "5 RGC play dates since June 1st of the previous year". We should probably rename these events the Turner and Goin show since these two members have managed to qualify for all of the NCGA events for the 2010 season. Congratulations to you both.

We have a new putting champion for 2010 and his name is Bryan Lange. He out putted everyone to walk away with cash and a trophy as well as bragging rights for the rest of the year. Congratulations to Bryan.

There are still many events scheduled for the rest of this year. One of the most popular is the "Club Championship" that is played in September. Since we have so many low handicappers in the club this year, the Championship should, once again, be a very competitive affair. Please remember that in almost all instances the club is required to submit a final player list 30 days before the actual event takes place. Once the contract is signed and a final player count is given to the course, we are "locked" in and there are no provisions for withdrawals and refunds. Once you commit to an "**away**" tournament the withdrawing player finding someone to take his place in the tournament best handles any withdrawal from the event. So, unless you find someone to take your place in the "**away**" event, the only guaranteed refund that the committee can issue is your prize fund amount.

I will be working on the 2011 Tournament schedule over the next few months and I would appreciate any input that the membership can give me as to venues you would like for RGC to try and secure for you. For the upcoming year we will be pursuing away tournaments in Monterey as well as the Reno/Carson City area and if you have a suggestion as to a particular course you would like to play, just drop me an e-mail and let me know your preference and I will do my best to secure it for us.

Once again remember to sign up by the "**Due Date**" in order to secure a spot in one of our tournaments.
