It's been a mild summer so far and things on the rules side have been fairly quiet. One subject that has come up is when looking for a lost ball the amount of time allowed has been shortened to 3 minutes. In the 2019 rules changes this was shortened to increase pace of play. The time starts when a player starts looking for his or her ball. I have checked my

watch while looking for a lost ball and it is not very long. I would recommend doing this on your own to see just how fast 3 minutes goes by. Remember when in doubt hit a provisional ball. Now that summer is here nobody wants to be out in the heat any longer than they have to.

The other thing I wanted to remind all players of is there is an area between the 16th and 17th hole where a tree fell, its ground under repair. The ground is torn up from the removal of the tree and there are still broken branches laying on the ground. I have marked it a couple times but it fades or gets mowed. Relief is allowed in this area until the area is repaired, nearest point of relief no closer to the hole.

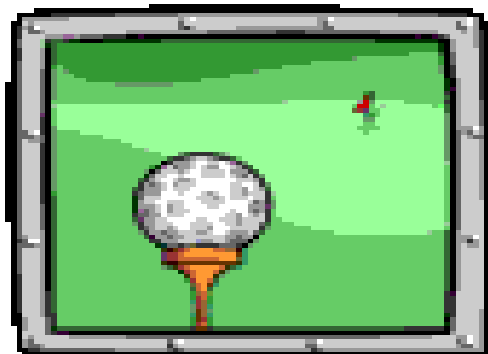
